The technical analysis in the Report is very thorough and I support providing those parts of the Report to DOE. If the Board believes the Department is creating a challenge to adequate protection by its determination of or application of specific technical requirements or the lack thereof, then the Board should evaluate and address that in the form of a Recommendation and highlight the safety consequences. I do not support those parts of the Report that proceed to displace DOE's requirement decisions with the Board's preferences.

I understand some on the Board believe that because this is not a Recommendation it does not require DOE to act and is not consequential, with or without a Reporting Requirement, and this is true. However, the Board's work is also provided for public consumption and some communications could be misleading regarding the potential impact on adequate protection to the public.
