I agree with Board Member Hamilton that the Board should carefully consider the issue of our jurisdiction before permitting our staff to proceed. I have recently learned of a planned mid-June review by our staff of the UPF project team's toxicological materials consequence analysis. In preparation for the review, our staff has requested from the project team various information, including an explanation as to why the project team intends to invoke certain DOE limits instead of the toxicological limits of the American Industrial Hygiene Association, a breakdown of toxicological material-at-risk by chemical compound type to include how that breakdown would be altered if materials burn in a fire, and a justification for the selection of certain factors used in an eight factor mathematical formula for estimating threshold (i.e., "safe") material-at-risk values.

Even a cursory look at the agenda sent by our staff to the UPF project team makes clear that a great deal of effort will be required by the project team to meet the demands of our staff. We should carefully consider whether it is prudent for our agency to demand such work of a contractor funded by another agency. While our statute requires us to advise the Secretary of Energy during the design of a new facility should we find changes are needed to ensure the adequate protection of the public health and safety, the statute only requires us to render advice "within a reasonable time" before construction begins. Construction is at least 15 months away, therefore the staff's planned review is not yet time-critical.

Regarding our jurisdiction, I urge careful consideration by the Board. I believe that our statute limits us to advising on nuclear safety issues. *Any* hazard at a defense nuclear facility could lead to a nuclear safety issue, but clearly there are some that we categorically avoid as outside our jurisdiction (e.g., security hazards). Meanwhile, there are some defense nuclear facilities that we pay little attention to because the nuclear safety hazard is not significant (e.g., the National Ignition Facility), and because we do not concern ourselves with that facility we might never learn of the presence of a new toxicological hazard. Most curiously, at the Hanford tank farms workers are currently complaining of illness brought on by exposure to chemical vapors, yet the staff has not conducted any independent analysis of that alleged hazard. Thus we appear to be interested in a review of toxicological hazards at a facility that will not operate for the better part of the next decade, whilst we keep our distance from complaints of toxicological hazards arising at a current facility.

I do not mean to imply that we should be conducting security reviews, or that more robust oversight of NIF is warranted, or that we should suddenly get knee-deep in tank farm vapors. I merely suggest that the jurisdiction question is more vexing than it might appear at first blush. In light of the work we are likely generating for the UPF design team and, further, in light of the time available prior to the start of UPF construction, the vexing question deserves careful consideration. I therefore support the request.
